ABOUT THE SPEAKER: Jack Halberstam is a professor in the Department of English and Comparative Literature and the Institute for Research on Women, Gender, and Sexuality at Columbia University. He is one of the leading voices in gender theory and queer studies who also has written extensively on literature, film, and visual arts. He exploded into the forefront of gender studies with his book *Female Masculinity* (Duke University Press, 1998). His other works include *In a Queer Time and Place* (New York University Press, 2005), *The Queer Art of Failure* (Duke University Press, 2011), and *Gaga Feminism: Sex, Gender, and the End of Normal* (Beacon Press, 2012). His most recent work, titled *Trans**, will be released later this year.
